Post-Operative Instructions for Hand & Wrist Surgery

- * Regular diet
- * Take your regular medication unless otherwise instructed
- ❖ Activity as tolerated, elevate arm above heart to prevent pain and swelling
- ❖ Leave your dressing on, you may remove dressing in two (2) days
- ❖ After you have removed the surgical bandage you may shower
- Place a band aid over incisions after showering
- ❖ For pain, take Tylenol or any prescription provided
- ❖ Call physician's office for follow-up appointment if one is not given
- Call you doctor if:
 - 1. Excessive bleeding
 - 2. Pain medicine does not relieve your discomfort or causes stomach upset, headache, rash or other abnormal reaction
 - 3. Fever over 101 degrees
 - 4. Persistent nausea, vomiting

Post-Operative Anesthetic Instructions

Anesthetics and other medications will be in your body for 24 hours, so you may feel a little sleepy. This feeling will slowly wear off but for the 24 hours the patient should **NOT**:

- **Drive a car, operate machinery or power tools**
- **❖** Drink any alcoholic drinks, even beer or wine
- ❖ If taking oral pain medication do NOT take on an empty stomach

Certain anesthetics and pain medications may produce nausea and vomiting in certain individuals. If nausea becomes a problem at home, start with liquids at first and gradually progress to usual diet.

If your throat is sore, cool liquids will help. Avoid acidic juices such as orange juice. If sore throat continues, Cepacol lozenges are available over the counter.
